

Ragi Doggweiler, M.D.

Dr. Ragi Doggweiler received her M.D. degree from Florence University Medical School in Florence, Italy, in 1991. She then completed a urology residency in 1996 at Florence University Medical School. She received training for six months in renal transplant at the University of Pittsburgh. She completed a fellowship of 2 1/2 years in Neuro-Urology and Neuromodulation at the University of Colorado Health Science Center in Denver. While at the University of Colorado Dr. Doggweiler did research on Intersitital Cystitis and Chronic Pelvic Pain.



Dr. Doggweiler joined the faculty of the Department of Urology at the University of Tennessee, Memphis in 1998 and transferred in 2006 to UT Knoxville. She is a member of various international and national professional organizations and has made numerous presentations and regularly publishes. She was guest editor for the World Journal of Urology on an issue on Chronic Plevic Pain. In November 1998 she became co-founder of the Special Interest Group on Pain of Urogenital Origin of IASP, and she served for 3 years as Editor of the group newsletter. She participated between 1999-2001 on several Janet Travell workshops regarding treatment of myofascial pain and trigger points. Since November of 2001 she is certified by the American Board of Holistic Medicine. In 2005 she became member of ASCH (American Society of Clinical Hypnosis). In 2006 she became member of the Medical Advisory Board of ICA-Deutschland, Germany

Her clinical practice and research focuses on management of interstitial cystitis, chronic pelvic pain and in general voiding and pelvic floor dysfunction. Her dream is to organize a multidisciplinary pelvic pain clinic where traditional and alternative medicine are combined to find individualized healing for each patient.
